It has been a busy year and I believe the members of the Foundation have worked hard to make sure the money you have generously contributed has gone to help address the oral health needs of the people in Massachusetts. The most recent grant went to the Harvard Street Community Health Center in Dorches-

ter. Several months ago, an urgent request came in for assistance in purchasing a new panorex machine. Their existing unit had broken and was unable to be

repaired because of its age. The Foundation made an off-cycle grant to the Health Center to assist in the purchase of a new unit to support the dental care that is provided to the members of this underserved community. Several members of the MDS leadership and myself were invited to the Harvard Street Community Health Center recently to see the new panorex in operation. Several of the dental staff commented on how



grateful they were for the Foundation support in obtaining the new unit and how it greatly improved the diagnostic ability of the clinical staff.

We have also continued to review requests for Ambassador Grants where any dentist in the MDS can request assistance in providing oral health related activities in their community. The Foundation has granted six Dr. Robert Lewando of these requests since the program started early this

year from services ranging from oral cancer screenings, oral health education, to making mouthguards. In all instances, the individuals benefitting from these services know it is coming from the MDS Foundation and the dentists supporting it.

This is your Foundation and the work that we do is on vour behalf. It is through our collective efforts that we continue to succeed.

The Worcester District Holds Its First Ambassador Program Event

MDS Foundation Ambassadors and Worcester District Dental Society members Dr. Charles Gagne and Dr. James Morin have partnered with the Blackstone Valley **Regional Vocational Technical High School** (BVT) and its freshman dental assisting class to provide oral health education to first-grade students at the Memorial Elementary School in Upton and the Henry P. Clough Elementary School in Mendon.

In total, 17 BVT students and their dental assisting instructors Amy Fleisher and Rebecca Corda, along with MDS Foundation Ambassador Dr. James Morin. visited the two elementary schools during April and May of 2016. More than 155 first grade students across eight classes participated in the Project S.M.I.L.E (Students Making Important Lasting Effects) events.

The Project S.M.I.L.E community service program was developed by BVT
