to the first mailing of the MDS Foundation newsletter. It has been a busy year and I believe the members of the Foundation have worked hard to make sure the money you have generously contributed has gone to help address the oral health needs of the people in Massachusetts. The most recent grant went to the Harvard Street Community Health Center in Dorchester. Several months ago, an urgent request came in for assistance in purchasing a new panorex machine. Their existing unit had broken and was unable to be repaired because of its age. The Foundation made an off-cycle grant to the Health Center to assist in the purchase of a new unit to support the dental care that is provided to the members of this underserved community. Several members of the MDS leadership and myself were invited to the Harvard Street Community Health Center recently to see the new panorex in operation. Several of the dental staff commented on how

grateful they were for the Foundation support in obtaining the new unit and how it greatly improved the diagnostic ability of the clinical staff.

We have also continued to review requests for Ambassador Grants where any dentist in the MDS can request assistance in providing oral health related activities in their community. The Foundation has granted six of these requests since the program started early this year from services ranging from oral cancer screenings, oral health education, to making mouthguards. In all instances, the individuals benefitting from these services know it is coming from the MDS Foundation and the dentists supporting it.

This is your Foundation and the work that we do is on your behalf. It is through our collective efforts that we continue to succeed.


AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

The main focus of the Ambassador event was to provide custom-fit sport mouthguards to local children and teens. In total, 66 individuals—many of whom play on the local football and lacrosse teams—sat for impressions and received guidance on proper oral health and the importance of wearing a mouthguard to prevent sports-related injuries. Given the retail value of a custom-fit mouthguard, which can range from \$120 to \$200, it's estimated that more than \$10,000 worth of products and services were donated that day.

Congratulations to MDS Foundation Ambassadors Drs. Diane Bonanni and Badrieh Edalatpour, who completed the Foundation's first-ever Ambassador Program event with the assistance of their colleagues Drs. Joy Kasparian-Federico and Roshanak Ghazinouri. The event, which was held in conjunction with the Stoneham Health and Wellness Expo at the Stoneham Middle School, took place on April 2, 2016.

MDS FOUNDATION - Targeted Grants

1 Attleboro-based Elder Dental Program received a \$2,000 grant to assist with the screening process for seniors seeking affordable dental care.

The organization assists local seniors in obtaining much-needed oral care at a reduced rate.

The discounted care is provided courtesy of area dentists who agree to participate in the program.


2 The Children's Dental Center in Gloucester received \$1,980 to fund 66 school bus transports to the center from the Gloucester public schools. Servicing the children of Cape Ann, the Children's Dental Center is sponsored by the City of Gloucester Health Department.

3 The Foundation Board also voted in favor of donating toothbrushes, toothpaste, and dental floss to the **Cape Kids Meal** organization, which provides prepacked bags of food for children who participate in the school system's free and reduced lunch and breakfast programs so that they can receive proper nutrition during non-school hours. With the grant funds, the program will be adding a "dental goodie bag" to the packages to help the children maintain proper oral hygiene.

Metropolitan District Dental Society

The MDS Foundation supported the Metropolitan District Dental Society at the Monster Fun Day in Wellesley on June 25, 2016. The event, hosted by Red Sox Radio (WEEI-FM), catered to more than 3,000 local children who received oral health education, toothpaste (provided courtesy of Proctor & Gamble) and custom MDS toothbrushes and timers. Attendees were able chow down on ball park-style food, and enjoy live entertainment and photo opportunities with the three Red Sox World Championship trophies and special guest appearances from Red Sox mascots Wally and his sister Tessie.

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

Access To Care Grant Recipients 2015–2016

Total amount for funding these six programs: **\$120,900**



1 **Volunteers in Medicine (VIM Berkshires)**

Hire a part-time quality assessment individual for a 6-month program and a part-time dental hygienist which will free up volunteer doctors and allow for more in-depth dental treatments.

2 **Edward M. Kennedy Community Health Center**

Build an additional operatory that will increase patient capacity by almost 1,000 visits per year and decrease wait times.

3 **Boston Medical Center**

Provide implant-supported overdentures to the underprivileged.

4 **Bridge Over Troubled Water**

Support the cost of day-to-day operations for the in-house dental clinic.

5 **Forsyth Institute**

To expand the Forsyth Kids School Oral Health Program to provide preventive care to school-aged children, as well as homeless children living in transitional housing.

6 **Community Health Center of Cape Cod**

Purchase autoclave, mobile cart, Dentrix software, and dental hygiene instruments.

AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

The Foundation's Ambassador Program gives MDS members an opportunity to join their colleagues in developing a community service project that benefits populations in need in communities where dentists live or work. The Foundation will donate up to \$2,000 for each approved project.

How It Works

1. **Decide** on your project and submit an application to the Foundation. Applications are available on the Foundation website (massdental.org/ambassador).
2. **Special consideration** will be given to those who develop a program that encompasses multiple areas of support from within their community.
3. **The Program must be supplemented by members** securing matching funds or donating in-kind services. Members must recruit at least one colleague to assist in project implementation.
4. **If approved, participants will receive a Foundation grant of up to \$2,000** to support their program.
5. **The MDS will provide a toolkit** to help members promote their program in their community. The MDS can also provide materials and supplies for certain projects, depending on their availability.
6. **Participants must provide the MDS with a video and/or photographs** from the event to be used for promotional purposes and to recognize members' contributions.

Ideas for Projects

The kind of program you develop is up to you. Projects can include children's dental screenings, veterans' dental screenings, oral cancer screenings, mouthguard programs, or activities associated with Children's Dental Health Month in February and Give Kids a Smile. MDS staff can also assist in identifying possible projects. Members are encouraged to reach out to other members in their communities and seek opportunities to participate in health fairs or at their local community health centers. Members can also expand partnerships with oral health vendors and suppliers to create large-scale programs in their communities.

The MDS Foundation helps members give back.
